Young Clapham Consortium Summer Highlights







This summer, the Young Clapham Consortium of which CPP is a member, delivered a range of exciting programmes for children and young people — from outdoor adventures and residential trips to essential training for youth practitioners. It's been a season of growth, learning and connection.

Knights Youth Centre

In July and August, Knights Youth Centre ran a five-week summer programme for children aged 8–18, featuring a three-day residential course, day trips like kayaking and paintballing, plus cooking and fitness sessions. Young people described it as their "best summer ever," building confidence and friendships along the way.

Understanding Knife Crime Training Consortium members also took part in **Understanding Knife Crime** training with the Ben Kinsella Trust, gaining valuable insights and strategies to support young people and keep them safe.

Community Chest

DA'ARO YOUTH PROJECT

This project has been in existence for a number of years, due to the commitment of Sarah Robson the Director, who has shown such passion and commitment to the welfare and development of the young people attending the project. The main aims are to promote the well-being and empowerment of these youngsters, many of whom are from Eritrea, East Africa, and who are seeking sanctuary and asylum in Great Britain.
