

From the Met Police: Parcel thefts

Residents.

With Christmas coming you will no doubt be having an increased number of packages and gifts delivered to your homes.

In the last few years mainly due to the recent pandemic more and more people are having packages delivered to their homes. A large number of these deliveries are left outside people's houses. This has made it extremely easy for thieves to steal packages and the number of theft related crimes has increased across the borough due to this.

We have arrested a number of suspects in the local area for committing these crimes but due to the fact the big companies generally replace items or refund stolen goods quickly it makes it very hard for police to prosecute suspects.

Parcels being left on the doorstep also indicates to Criminals that you may not be home which has led to residents' properties being burgled and especially at this time of year this can be extremely upsetting.

As your local ward team we kindly recommend and ask when you are ordering packages and gifts if you could request for them to be delivered to one of your local delivery hubs/shops or lockers. All major companies and online retailers offer this service and these hubs/shops and lockers are usually found in close proximity to most addresses. If you look on Google you will be able to find your local drop off points.

Alternatively if you don't want to do this please arrange delivery for a day you're going to be in, ask for the package to be delivered to a neighbour or if no one is home you can request the package is kept by the courier and you can arrange a date for retry.

If you would like to get in contact with us to discuss this, crime prevention advice or any other local policing issue please feel free to contact us. If you see a suspect on your road or outside a property stealing packages please call 999 to give police the best chance of catching these criminals.
